This course will provide an overview of several cheap or free alternatives to these commonly-used reference software packages. Popular citation management tools such as Citeulike, Zotero, Connotea and Papers will be covered. Content will include feature comparisons, effective use of each program and why you might use one over another. This course can benefit librarians who would like to introduce their users to new bibliographic management tools or who need to support their users who might already be working with these tools. Students will learn what it takes to create mobile applications and websites, and will participate in a hands-on activity to create a simple mobile website.
